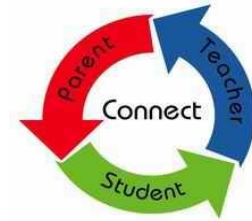

### School Attendance

Students who attend school regularly do much better on exams. As per House Bill 5, students may not be given class credit or a final course grade unless the student is in attendance for at least 90% of the time the class is offered. Students who fall below 90% will receive an “LOC” (Loss of Credit) on their semester report card. This can impact whether your child is allowed to pass to the next grade level. Attendance is counted for every class period.
