<p>1. Safe and Supportive Learning Environment</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SISD Safety Zone: El Paso: Day 3 in Green Zone at 9.49% <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Timeline- Next Wednesday SISD Cabinet meets. It is possible that a transition to the Green Zone will happen. This means that April 5 might be when we transition into green zone. This will depend on the hospitalization rates remaining under 10 percent. We have prepared for this influx of students by creating hybrid early elementary courses, lunch in the classroom routines, and safety protocols. In the case that the zones change the new CDC recommendation is social distancing of at least 3 feet apart; the recommendation is still 6 ft for adults (See the link below). If the number of students exceed the spots we can provide, SISD will determine if we need to modify our current 6ft social distancing rule. The CDC still recommends 6 ft of social distancing between adults. Coaches are following 6 ft apart in the building and 10 ft apart while outdoors. A survey will go out to those that have not been vaccinated to get more information to their reasoning. • Safe Station Work/Hands-on Activities <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Teachers throughout the campus have begun safe stations in the classrooms to promote hands on learning for students on campus. You may choose to provide different activities for specific students, they receive separate pieces if necessary. Students remain in the squares doing their activity. We are not at the point of collaborative stations, but independent stations can be utilized to encourage blended learning. Safety first, no students share any materials. • Purple Heart will continue to be a Pre-K Hub next year. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 3-year-old PreK students had a high retention rate this year, and the district is expanding hubs in different feeder patterns.
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<p>2. College and Career Readiness</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • AVID Weekly Activities (Suarez) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The weekly AVID activities were sent out campus wide today. The campus AVID team have been working to put weekly activities together for the campus that can meet the needs of all students. Integration of annotations and writing will be integrated throughout the weeks coming. College activities will still be embedded. • Class Kick (Rivera) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The campus wide order has been submitted so all teachers can begin utilizing it. Teachers can provide instant feedback. It works in real time; this means teachers can see what students are doing real time and provide feedback. You can assign to whole class or small groups and specific rosters. • SCIE Updates (Arvizu) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ A form will go out tomorrow for resources to be purchased for the next school year. Please encourage teams to fill out the form in the week window. • STEAM Academy and STEAM JR <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Charter schools are using their STEAM programs to advertise student enrollment. The goal is to run a STEAM JR and STEAM Academy where teachers will pull students to complete activities with specific groups of students that are age appropriate. If Covid guidelines allow, students will be taken on fieldtrips and will eventually turn into an academy that cycles throughout the years. If any teachers are interested, let Ms. White know. • Acceleration Plans: Fidelity, Attendance, & Data Review (90,60, 30 Goals & 20 Point Percentage Growth from BOY) (White) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Be mindful that we are implementing fidelity when we are holding tutoring, small groups or interventions. Ensure we are communicating with parents and building relationships. The goal is 20% growth from BOY to EOY. Some PLC's will be designated for trauma informed Nearpod's to be completed. This is a TEA requirement. • New CAC Schedule and Times <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Look out for the new CAC times that begin at 2:00 for elementary. Teachers must let parents know that students will go asynchronous. Teachers will be provided coverage to watch their in-person students or students will need to go to a buddy class next door.
