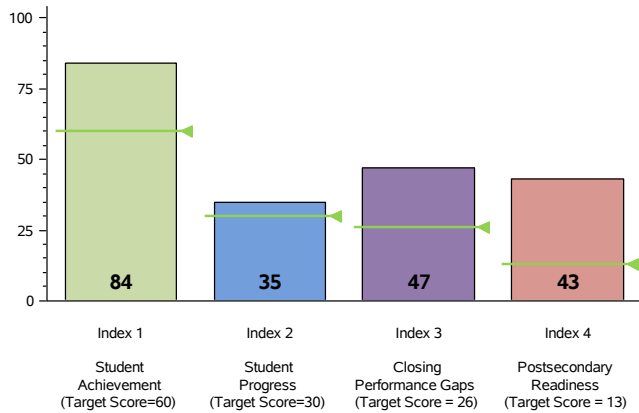

2016 Performance Index
