

SUPERINTENDENT'S PARENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE	The Superintendent's Parent Advisory Committee shall be formed for the purpose of providing input to the Superintendent.
MEMBERSHIP	The Superintendent's Parent Advisory Committee shall be composed of the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Each campus shall be represented by a maximum of two parents, who are non-employees of the District;2. Representatives from each campus shall be recommended by the Principal and approved by the Superintendent. <p>Members of the Superintendent's Parent Advisory Committee shall serve a one (1) school year term.</p>
MEETING FREQUENCY	The committee will meet every nine (9) weeks unless otherwise called.
RESPONSIBILITIES	The Superintendent's Parent Advisory Committee shall assume the following responsibilities: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Express parent concerns and problems;2. Propose solutions to stated problems;3. Provide input concerning policy, regulations and program design;4. Discuss the Superintendent's priority goals to include parental involvement, communication and other related topics;5. Provide input regarding ways to improve student/staff/community and parent relations;6. Provide input regarding the appropriation and use of fiscal and human resources; and7. Report on student achievement in academic and extracurricular areas.
SUPERINTENDENT'S STUDENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE	A high school Superintendent's Student Advisory committee shall be formed for the purpose of providing input to the Superintendent. The group will be representative of the student body and will meet on a regular basis.
MEMBERSHIP	The Superintendent's Student Advisory Committee may be composed of the following: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The Student Council President2. One student officer representing each grade classification3. Three students chosen at Principal's discretion

RESPONSIBILITIES

The committee will meet every nine (9) weeks unless otherwise called.

The Superintendent's Student Advisory Committee shall assume the following responsibilities:

1. Express student concerns and problems.
2. Propose solutions to stated problems.
3. Provide input concerning policy, regulations and program design.
4. Discuss the Superintendent's priority goals. This will include dropout prevention strategies, the counseling program, improved academic performance and other related topics.
5. Discuss major social problems facing young people. This will include drug and alcohol abuse, teen pregnancy, AIDS and other related topics.
6. Provide input regarding ways to improve student/staff relations.
7. Provide input regarding the appropriation and use of fiscal and human resources.
8. Report on student achievement in academic and extracurricular areas.

The Superintendent's Principal Advisory Committee shall be formed for the purpose of providing input to the Superintendent. The District recognizes the value of input from campus principals as the District proceeds with efforts to improve student achievement and increases school effectiveness.

MEMBERSHIP

The committee will consist of eight(8) principals from Socorro ISD. The principals from each of the six (6) feeder patterns will elect one(1) representative to serve on the Superintendent's AD-HOC Principals' Advisory Committee. The superintendent shall appoint three(3) additional principals in order to balance the committee. Members will serve a two(2) year term. No principal may serve two(2) consecutive terms.

MEETING
FREQUENCY

The committee will meet on the first Thursday of every other month during the school year unless otherwise called.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Superintendent's Principal Advisory Committee shall assume the following responsibilities:

1. Discuss and evaluate District initiatives.
2. Discuss matters which affect instruction of the students as well as the overall operation of the schools.
3. Provide input concerning policy, regulations and program design.
4. Provide input regarding the appropriation and use of fiscal and human resources.
5. Report on student achievement in academics and extracurricular areas.
6. Provide input regarding ways to improve school/parents relations.
7. Committee members shall be responsible for disseminating information discussed in meetings to the principals in their respective feeder pattern.
