Syllabus 2nd Semester

3rd Nine Weeks

<u>Developing Readers and Writers Using Informational Text</u> – Students explore informational text that clarifies or explains something.

<u>Developing Readers and Writers Using Informational Text</u> – Students recognize different purposes of media with adult assistance (media – a variety of ways people communicate with others such as commercials, newspapers, magazines, product labels, websites

<u>Research – Making a Plan</u> - Determine, locate, and explore relevant sources (e.g., books, websites, newspapers, magazines, librarians, local experts) that address the research question.

4th Nine Weeks

<u>All About Literacy</u> - Students use previously learned skills to examine the literary genre by making comparisons to their own experiences, ideas across texts and to the larger community.

<u>Making Connections</u> -During this unit students experience a variety of literary and informational texts to strengthen vocabulary and reading comprehension and make connections to personal experiences.
