- ◆ Provide students who have not met standards on End Of Course (EOC) exams the opportunity to retake all state assessments.
- ◆ Support students who have not met standards in End of Course (EOC) exams through interventions with a State Compensatory Education Intervention Coach (SCEI)

- ◆ Support and encourage our children to become college ready by ensuring that school work meets high standards of academic achievement, and by communicating with the school regarding issues that impede academic success

- ◆ Social Studies: will improve 100%
- ◆ Dual credit course enrollment will increase by 10%
