



Ms. Brasgalla, Assistant Principal, called meeting to order at 4:30 PM.

I. Title I Budget Review

- **Title I Budget Review** – A piece of the Title I account has been set to get a 3rd SCEI coach. This person will focus on math and interventions. Once approved by cabinet it will be opened and posted. We are hopeful that this person will be on board come spring semester. Mr. Gomez explained that Title I is the classification of students based on low socio-economic status. We are a schoolwide campus because we are at the percentage of student population that qualify.

II. EPAC Review

- **EPAC Review** – At the September meeting, staffing patterns were discussed. They said 5th grade and up should be capped at 26. Teacher transfers are not always guaranteed. Teachers who are on an intervention plan are not eligible for transfers. Displaced teachers are placed first. Next meeting is in January.

III. Intersession Overview

- **Intersession Overview** – Mr. Marquez and Ms. Nunn went thru Eduphoria reports and incoming 9th grade students who were not successful on 1st EOC exam were invited to intersession. The rotations will be 8:30AM – 12:30 PM. Re-testers and Eng I camp will run throughout the day. Eng I-II camp – 296; There should be no extra-curricular practices during this time. Cafeteria will not serve breakfast - only lunch. SCEI coaches have obtained incentives for students and teachers. Please put in facilities requests for intersession ASAP. TSI testing will also take place. 50 spots include both CTE and non-CTE students. Will test on Thursday.
- **Oct 14 staff development** – The morning will be devoted to teachers to grade OERs – After lunch will be professional development rotations – the RTI team will share information from their trip, technology (Tyler 360, Microsoft teams) and OER, job-a-like for CTE will be off campus. Fine arts will also be off campus. Department chairs suggest planning at the beginning of day.
- **Failure Rate** – handout provided – sorted by courses/6 weeks. This year, open ended responses are 50% of the grade for 3 weeks and 6 weeks exams. It had an impact on the grades. It is an adjustment. These numbers are from 6wks eduphoria grades. The data was pulled according to the 6-weeks progress report grades. Students were identified and they're 1st and 8th period teachers have been contacted. Let teachers know which students are coming in.

IV. Tutoring (1st & 8th Periods)

- **Tutoring 1st & 8th Periods** – This started today and they are showing up without any work. Please provide the work so that they have something to do. In the PLCs, speak of the interventions and what to do when they don't get it. We care too much for our kids to allow them to get by with bare minimum. Since grades are due upon return this may help them to improve the grade for this nine weeks.
