



Ms. Brasgalla, Assistant Principal, called meeting to order at 4:33 PM.

Motion to approve November minutes as is made by D. Ciceri-Barrozo; seconded by C. Lopez unanimously approved.

I. Project Vida

- **Project Vida** – Update presented by Jessica Lerma and Amanda Lopez. Presentations are scheduled for gang prevention, dating violence, etc. There are a number of students being served by the LPC – at this time there are slots available for counseling. Insurance is not necessary. Students will not be turned away. Title 10 is under healthy Texas living and is more open and allows services to be provided without charge. The navigator gets a referral, talks to parents, and then comes in with paperwork to the counselor, at which time they are referred to the proper person. New clients usually begin with a family session. The Power for Youth curriculum is already in place with Mr. Widner on Wednesdays. Mr. Gonzalez's will begin next week on Thursdays. The program focuses on positive decision making, pregnancy prevention, etc. Also discussed were: baby safe surrender and David's legacy. There will be activities scheduled during lunchtime and intersession. A calendar will be provided.

II. Intersession

- **Intersession** – Ms. Jansen presented - The basic courses will run Monday thru Thursday, March 9-12, 2020, 8am to 12pm. There will also be EOC camps, as well as 'masters' camps, for those who want to exceed their previous met standard. The AP teachers will also be arranging tutoring camps. All extracurricular practices will be early in the morning or after 12:00. Ms. Nunn and Mr. Espinoza, the SCEI coaches, will work with department chairs on invites for students and staffing for each area. If you are working intersession, please be sure to sign in on a green sheet for compensation.

III. Failure Report

- **Failure Report** - Please be aware of who failing students are at the 3wks and 6wks to pull out those students and give them the extra needed help. It is important that parents are notified if students will not be meeting the credit averaging goals.

IV. OPEN

- The mother daughter conference will be at Americas high school this Saturday Feb 1st. Eight hours of LOC credit available for students who need it. They need to sign in with Ms. Sanchez at the sign in table. Free breakfast, lunch and a t-shirt. Register by Wednesday (tomorrow) EHS will be hosting for the next 5 years alternating the father son and mother daughter conferences.
- Next month is volunteer recognition. Everyone needs to submit their hours as soon as possible. There is a luncheon and each campus will have one volunteer that will be recognized. In March, Partners in Education will be recognized, as well. Notify Ms. Sanchez of nominations.
- Leaders are asked to volunteer with Ms. Sanchez to help with campus policy development. Necessary changes need to be done by March and submit to SIT in April.
- Looking again at PTSA – need leadership. It has not been happening and admin needs to decide what to do; whether to dissolve the group or not.
- Safety – still finding rocks in the doorways. We should not need to check cameras. Sunday morning between 6AM and 645AM, two students tried to get in the building. They picked up a landscape stone to break a door handle. Be sure to lock up all doors. There have been times when a classroom door may be left unlocked. Be extra careful and vigilant. Be out in the hallways be visible during transitions. NO FOOD DELIVERIES – The superintendent and many from leadership heard of it. There are some complaints, but the decision is supported.
- May 16th is Stand and Deliver. The project is to bring back students who have dropped. If you attend stand and deliver you will get the half day off on last day of school.
- Ordered shirts will be worn on parent night Feb 27th.

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- February 12th is JobCon. This event will impact the entire campus and parking lots will be closed in front of the gym.
- On Saturday, February 15th the campus will be used for Destination Imagination – the entire campus will be used. Put away personal items so that there is nothing missing. If you'd like to volunteer, check with Ms. Akins.
- The district did an internal audit and checked graduates of all campuses. Transcripts and audit cards were reviewed and there were errors found that impacted diplomas. One additional counselor and one additional PEIMS/Attendance Clerk will be hired specifically to deal with LOC (Loss of Credit). Both positions have already been posted and will work closely with Mr. Gomez upstairs in the F hallway.
- February 14th no deliveries will be accepted – there will be a call out to notify parents; no deliveries for anyone. All items causing distractions can be taken up and left in office. There will be a dance for the PAS and SLU kids in the black box on February 14th
- Pep Rally scheduled for Friday is cancelled – will be rescheduled for February
- Choir wants to apply for cords for graduation. They are advised to model after NHS and NTHS. It needs to be known what the expectations are in writing.
- Tardies – do not send them back to the office. The areas at the opposite ends of the campus are allowed a few extra minutes.
- Library has seen a very big improvement in passes for students being sent to the library. Thank you!
- Hall passes will be color coded by hallway. Library and nurse will still get the pink passes.
- Murphy – students are going into class before the tardy bell rings then leave. Make sure they are not released during the first or last 10 minutes of class.
- There are students going into the copy room getting sodas – some say they are being sent by their teacher/coach.
- Let students and parents know that VITA will start next week Tuesday and Wednesday in F105 – maximum income level is \$36,000 and the hours are from 4:30PM to 7:00PM.
- Thank you to the custodians for all you do!! Thank you to Officer Murphy and his team for keeping us safe! There is a reason for the added security. Please follow safety protocols at all times.
- Drugs/violence – we've had fights last month – the fights have stopped. Some things that are happening at the other campuses are causing things to happen here.
- Facilities request forms must be filled out for any meeting happening after hours.
- Some teachers keep phones when students go to restroom or have cell phone day care – good idea.
- One of our feeder schools changed their master schedule – they went to a 9 period day and 33 minute lunch. It has worked well. Teachers will teach 7 classes and have one PLC and one conference. The lunch schedule would stay the same. Proposed schedule for us would be 8:30AM to 4:15PM. Class periods and transitions stay the same. Might need 3 lunch periods. Work in progress.
- On February 12th choral students Labrado and Talavera will audition – Ms. Labrado also auditioned for a solo. KUDOS to her! 😊
- Ms. Carmona-Lopez shared that UTEP has informed them that more than 50% of the students entering into the college of education are from Socorro ISD and the ACE program. Awesome news!
- This Monday will be the lotto drawing for FECHS – out of 190 applicants only 135 get selected.
